

## Auszug aus dem Bericht eines Stipendiaten

At this point in time, I have completed my studies at the University of Freiburg with a Masters of Arts (MA) in Global Studies from the Global Studies Program. During the duration of this program, I was able to study at partner universities, the University of Cape Town (second term, South Africa) and Chulalongkorn University (third term, Thailand). For the first, fourth and fifth terms we, as a student batch, are required to be at the University of Freiburg.

When the pandemic initially struck, I was in Thailand at the partner university and was supposed to be doing a paid internship there before coming back to Germany to do the last two terms. As a result, I was not able to work in Thailand, or anywhere for that matter, and was not making any money. Once I got back to Germany, I realized that completing the program would be in jeopardy due to my financial standing. I had worked for almost three years full time prior to starting this program in 2019 and had already spent my entire savings. I only had the fourth and fifth semesters left to finish the program and I was determined to do so because I had planned to study in Freiburg since 2015. I learned about the Maria-Ladenburger scholarship, applied, and was incredibly happy to find out that I had received it to finish the program.
